

NABIP Legislative Council Brief Overview

The Legislative Council plays a critical role in shaping and advancing NABIP's federal legislative and regulatory positions. It champions policies that support continued and improved choice, accessibility, and affordability of healthcare for all Americans.

Legislative Council Composition

- Chair, Vice Chair, Manager, Immediate Past Chair
- 8 Regional Legislative Chairs & 7 Working Group Chairs
- NABIP Government Affairs Staff

Legislative Council

- Sets the overarching federal priorities for the Council for the term year
- Actively engages in the monthly 1-hour meetings on the first Tuesday of each month
- Attends key NABIP events, including the Capitol Conference, Annual Convention, and regional/state events
- Represents NABIP in the media and with relative lawmakers, when requested

Working Groups

Working Group Chairs:

- Set annual goals for the group, with the group's feedback
- Organize and facilitate monthly 1-hour meetings
- Delegate working group projects and ensure follow-through
- Reporting progress to the Legislative Council throughout the month and at monthly meetings

Working Group Members:

- Deliver subject-matter expertise and strategic ideas
- Lead initiatives from start to finish to achieve the group's objectives
- Attend and actively participate in monthly meetings
- Helping develop policy materials and engaging in advocacy efforts

In partnering with NABIP staff, these efforts can include:

- Responding to Federal agency proposed rules via writing comment letters
- Meeting with Members of Congress, including committee members with industry influence
- Meeting with third parties, including think tanks, Congressional commissions, or the media



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Regional Legislative Groups

Regional Legislative Group representation ensures two-way communication between NABIP's national leadership and state/local levels. Chairs and members share developments and trends while relaying federal updates downward.

Regional Legislative Chairs:

- Organize monthly 1-hour meetings with State Legislative Chairs (SLCs) in their region
- Ensure SLCs report legislative developments and trends
- Identify regional priorities and convey them to the Legislative Council
- Share federal updates with SLCs for communication to state chapters

Member Expectations

All members of the Legislative Council, Working Groups, and Regional/State Legislative Chairs must uphold NABIP's **Speak with One Voice policy** when publicly representing NABIP at any level of membership. This includes **public speaking engagements**, **chapter meetings**, and **meetings with lawmakers and the media**.

All members of the Legislative Council, Working Groups, and Regional/State Legislative Chairs are expected to **establish relationships with their federal and state legislators' offices** to advocate for NABIP members and the positive role members play within communities. Members must <u>log these meetings</u> with NABIP's Government Affairs staff to unify advocacy efforts.
