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Employer Reporting Improvement Act Passes the House

Washington, D.C. – The House of Representatives today took another step in advancing the Employer Reporting Improvement Act, H.R. 3801, originally sponsored by Representatives Mike Thompson (D-CA) and Adrian Smith (R-NE). NABIP has been advocating for employer-reporting relief for over a decade and applauds the bill sponsors and the Ways and Means Committee for passing the bill out of committee 37-0.
